Our teacher has a box around his desk that is at least 2 meters away from our desks.

The teachers and S.N.As wear masks when they have to come close to help us with our work.

We have hand sanitizer dispensers all over the school.

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

They have trapped lots of zombies. They defeated the boss zombie who was called Blobber. They have saved the world and they have decided to repopulate the world.



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
